

Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Coloring Pages and Writing Prompts



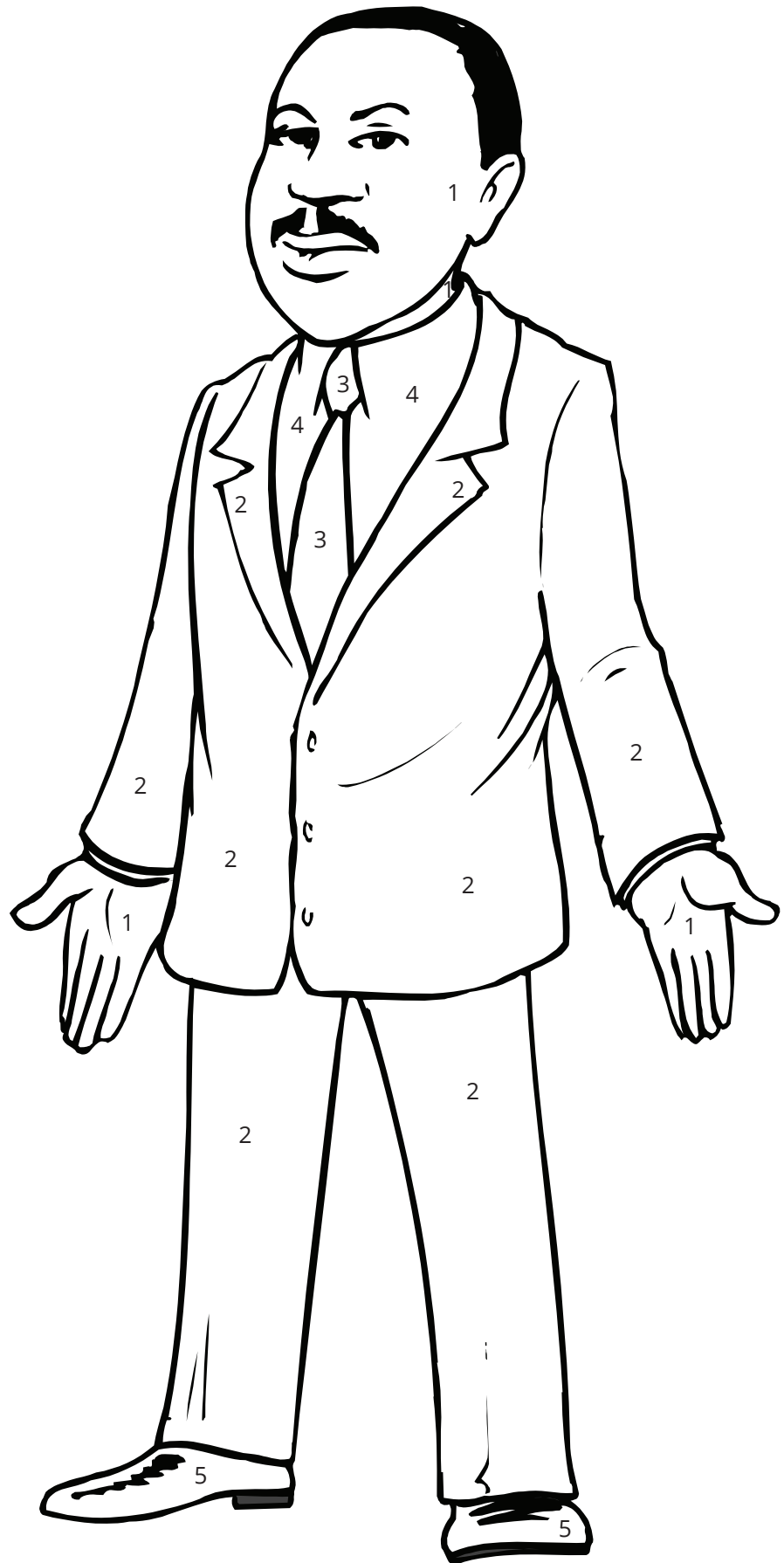
Celebrate Martin Luther King, Jr. and his accomplishments in your classroom through writing prompts, coloring pages, or both!

Write a thank-you to Dr. King for helping to make the world a better place.

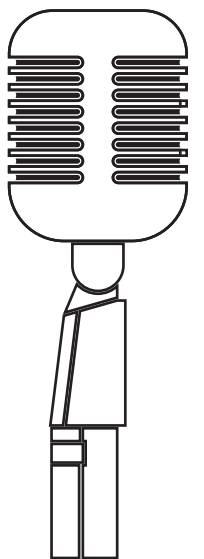
